Principal of Norfolk Village State School, Mr Chris Capra said, "The new shaded areas will create additional outdoor shaded eating and learning areas. The new structures will also be of benefit to a range of community groups that currently use the Performing Arts Centre."

Funding of up to \$35,000 from the Gambling Community Benefit Fund and up to \$150,000 from the Jupiter's Casino Community Benefit Fund is available quarterly. Application closing dates are 28 February, 31 May, 31 August and 30 November each year. Approximately \$50m is granted annually from the four community benefit funds across Queensland.

The Gambling Community Benefit Fund provides one-off grants to Queensland not for profit community organisation, with revenues sourced from gaming taxes placed on Golden Casket lotteries, wagering, keno and gaming machines.
